FLY SPIRIT NONSTOP FROM MKE TO MYRTLE BEACH THIS SUMMER

MILWAUKEE (February 23, 2022) – Spirit Airlines is adding Myrtle Beach to its growing list of destinations served nonstop from Milwaukee this summer. The new flights also give South Carolina residents the opportunity to travel to Milwaukee to enjoy Wisconsin's world-class golf, festivals, sports, dining, and outdoor recreation.

Myrtle Beach is the ninth nonstop destination for Spirit from MKE. The airline launched its Milwaukee service in June of last year, with daily nonstop flights from MKE to Los Angeles, Las Vegas, and Orlando. By the end of 2021, Spirit was also flying nonstops from Milwaukee to Fort Lauderdale, Fort Myers, Tampa, Phoenix, and Cancun.
