SOUTHWEST AIRLINES ANNOUNCES SPRING BREAK 2024 SCHEDULE

MILWAUKEE (August 17, 2023) – This upcoming spring break season, Southwest Airlines will expand service from Milwaukee Mitchell International Airport (MKE), including adding more frequent flights to numerous popular warm weather destinations. The airline’s March spring break schedule features flight increases to 11 destinations currently served from MKE.

In the schedule running from March 7 through April 8, 2024, the airline will offer:

- Increased weekday service to Nashville, Denver, Las Vegas, Kansas City, Orlando, Phoenix, Fort Myers, and Tampa.
- Increased Sunday service to Cancun, Orlando, Phoenix, Sarasota, and Tampa.
- Increased Saturday service to Cancun, Dallas, Denver, Fort Lauderdale, Las Vegas, Orlando, Phoenix, Fort Myers, Sarasota, and Tampa.

As part of the increase, weekend flights to Cancun and Sarasota will be offered on both Saturdays and Sundays, up from Saturday-only weekend service in March 2023. On weekdays, MKE will offer 3-5 flights per day to Nashville, Orlando, Las Vegas, Phoenix, and Denver, along with daily or twice-daily service to Kansas City, Fort Myers, and Tampa.

“We’re excited to see Southwest adding so many additional flight frequencies for this upcoming spring break season,” said Airport Director Brian Dranzik. “With so many flights, destinations, and Southwest’s competitive fares, the only hard part of planning spring break travel from MKE is deciding where you want to go.”

Southwest is MKE’s largest carrier and offers two free checked bags, no change fees, and no seat assignment fees. Flights can be booked at [Southwest.com](https://www.southwest.com) or on the Southwest Airlines mobile app.

Milwaukee Mitchell International Airport offers nonstop flights to 30+ destinations coast-to-coast, and more than 200 international destinations are available with one easy connection.
